

From the Guidance Department...

Seniors: This is a time of great anxiety for seniors. Some are still waiting to hear if they have been accepted at their reach schools. Others are trying to decide where to send the deposit that will hold that spot at the college they will call home for the next four years. Many colleges hold "Accepted Student" days. When two or more colleges have offered similar packages and the choice is hard to make, an additional visit where you can meet the incoming class is a great opportunity to finalize that decision. Please have your children stop by the guidance office if they are having trouble deciding where to go. We will help them weigh the pros and cons of each choice. Once the decision is made, an excellent book to read and discuss is <u>1001 Things Every College Student Needs to Know</u> by Harry H. Harrison. It has practical information and sensitive topics that should be discussed before students move away from home. It is available at Amazon.com or at Barnes & Noble.

Often, once the college choice is made, seniors feel they are finished with high school and ready to coast through the final weeks of school. Please be aware that attendance and grades still count. Colleges may rescind acceptance or scholarship offers if there is a radical decline in grades when the final transcript is sent. But most of all, seniors must graduate from high school to be able to attend college. Every year we have had students who jeopardize their college acceptance. It is painful when a student is not allowed to graduate because they have failed a class. Please do not let this happen in the Class of 2011.

<u>Juniors</u>: At the Junior Parent Night on March 10th you were given a package of forms that need to be returned to the guidance office. Please remember the due date of April 1st. This packet includes the transcript release form, the student self-evaluation, parent response form, and request for letters of recommendation form. Please try to be complete and return the first three forms to the guidance office by the due date. This information is invaluable for writing letters of recommendation.

Also, your children should be registering for the May 7 or June 4 SATs (April 8 is the deadline for May and May 6 is the deadline for June). If they are considering taking SAT II (Subject Tests) for a subject they have second semester, then June is the ideal time for those tests.

The New Jersey National College Fair will be held: on Wednesday April 6 at the NJ Convention and Exposition Center in Edison from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm and from 6:00 to 8:30 pm; on April 4 at the Ranney School in Tinton Falls at 7:00 on Thursday April 7 at Brookdale Community College from 6:30 to 8:30 pm.

Sophomores: We will be meeting individually with each sophomore. We will explain the elective courses for next year and that some junior year electives are prerequisites for senior year electives. If they want to follow the art path, then Illustration and Design is a prerequisite for Advanced Design. If they want film, then DV II is a prerequisite for Electronic Field Production; Live Studio Production is a prerequisite for Advanced Studio Production. Also, during these meetings we emphasized the many facets of the Naviance Program. We have asked them to complete the *Personality Type* and *Career Interest Survey* if they have not done so already. We showed them how to do a college search and how to find out if other students from CHS were accepted at that college.

Freshmen: Counselors will meet with freshmen individually in April. We will be focusing on using Naviance to begin to explore career interests. We will remind students that they should focus on keeping their GPA above 92 if they want to be considered for National Honor Society. The requirements for NHS are outlined in the student handbook and reinforced on the BBS. Students must have 100 hours of community service and 50 hours of leadership. Some of the hours in both categories must be in school and some in the community. The summer is a great time to get community service hours. The students can volunteer with a hospital, the Red Cross, an animal shelter, the local library, or at a vacation bible school. Community service cannot be paid (in most instances) or for your own family. (Sorry, free babysitting for younger siblings does not count.)

<u>All Students</u>: The midterm exams will be given on Monday, April 4 for periods 1 and 3, and on Tuesday, April 5 for periods 2 and 4. The year really starts to move at a blistering pace after midterms, so please help your children keep focused academically.

Freshmen Start off Spring Semester with Effective Speech

Effective Speech is designed to help ninth grade students develop the skills necessary to become effective communicators. Since my philosophy is that students learn best by doing, classroom activities have included creative assignments that promote student participation and involvement. Given that many students are fearful of speaking, we began the marking period with partner speeches. This skit project helped decrease the students' anxiety while allowing them to be creative and dramatic. The rest of the term will provide students with some very invaluable skills, allowing them to organize ideas, be aware of nonverbal messages and to continue to develop interpersonally.
