We thought it would be a good idea to explain to the new CHS families who we are and what we do. We have always counted on the support of the parents to accomplish our goals. Through the years the PSFA has helped us in every big event that we have organized. We would like to thank you and to let you know what are we going to be doing during the school year 2011-2012.

The Cultural Communications Club is one of the unofficial clubs at CHS. It is also the biggest in the school with 112 members. There are no skills, age, or grades required to become a member. The only requirement needed is to be generous, dedicated, and willing to donate some personal time to help others.

We work with many organizations every year. We donate our time and/or make monetary donations to Salvation Army, Head Start, Special Olympics, Boys and Girls of America, Jersey Cares, Newbury School/Autism Awareness Program, and Monmouth County Human Relations Commission.

Our main fundraisings come from four different events:


