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From the Guidance Department...

Seniors: We are coming down to the one of the most difficult choices your child will have to make. As the letters of acceptance roll in, the anxieties about which school is the best fit take center stage. Take advantage of the accepted student weekends so your child will have another opportunity to view the campus and also meet some possible future classmates.

If you have not filed your FAFSA forms, it is not too late. If your child is eligible for any merit scholarships offered by the college, your FAFSA form must be submitted. We continue to update the BBS with the latest scholarship forms and information. Also, remember to check on Naviance for other scholarship opportunities. The address for student access is <u>http://connection.naviance.com/communications</u>. If your child forgot their log in or password they should stop by the guidance office and it can be updated. Seniors who have a 90 or better GPA at the end of the 1st semester will be given an application for the Graduation Award sponsored by the PSFA. The deadline to return these applications to guidance is Friday, April 13th.

As always, we ask for your support in keeping the seniors focused throughout the final semester of high school.

Juniors: HSPA tests will be given to the junior class on March 6th, 7th, and 8^{th.} The testing will be during the first two periods of the day and the schedule is as follows: Math on Tuesday, March 6th; Language Arts on Wednesday, March 7th and Thursday, March 8th. On Tuesday, March 6th, the students need calculators that can perform algebraic functions, have the ability to do roots and powers, and contain at least one memory cell. The students also need to bring two #2 pencils every day. Please make sure your child is here EVERY DAY and on time to take the tests. There are make-up testing days the following week, but we hope there will be perfect attendance. If they do not take the test during those two weeks, they will have to take them in October of senior year. If students do not pass the HSPA, they do not graduate from High School.

No electronic devices, including cell phones, ipods, food, or drinks are permitted in testing rooms. Per the New Jersey Department of Education, students found in possession of cell phones or other electronic devices while taking the HSPA will have their test voided.

Juniors need to be thinking about registering for the SATs in May or June. The deadline for registration is April 6th for the **May 5th** test and May 8th for the **June 2nd** exam. **SAT II exams are also given on these test dates.** ACT tests dates are April 14th with a March 9th registration deadline and June 9th with a May 4th deadline.

Thursday, March 8th at 6:30 pm is Junior Parent Night. Students should attend with their parents to learn everything you ever wanted to know about the college search and the application process. You will find this to be an invaluable tool as you begin to explore the college application process. We will cover such topics as the college search, college admissions, letters of recommendation, testing, individual responsibilities, timelines and Naviance.

Nominating Committee Needed

Each year the Communications High School PSFA holds elections for officers. In order to prepare for the elections, a Nominating Committee is needed to identify candidates who are interested in serving on the PSFA Executive Board for the 2012-2013 academic year. Elections for CHS PSFA officers will be held in May. Each year the PSFA seeks candidates who are willing to dedicate their time and talents to serve as officers in the organization. The Executive Board consists of six positions: two Co-Presidents who preside over the meetings; one Vice President who assists the Co-Presidents and acts on their behalf in their absence; one Treasurer who keeps accurate records of all PSFA monies and pays all approved bills for the PSFA; one Recording Secretary who keeps the minutes and attendance for all PSFA meetings; and one Corresponding Secretary who is responsible for sending out proper notices for all regular meetings and handling PSFA correspondence

In order to be considered by the Nominating Committee, you must be a registered active member of the PSFA. Nomination forms will be distributed via this issue of the Communiqué and will be available on the BBS. Go to chs.mcvsd.org; click on "PSFA"; click on "Forms and Messages."

The PSFA Nominating Committee is scheduled to present a slate of candidates for office in April, and will hold elections for the 2012-2013 Executive Board at our meeting in May. Nominations will be accepted up until the election date.
