LEARNING TO DRIVE THE 'RITE' WAY

Just Rite Driving School (http://bit.ly/justritedrivingschool) will offer a 30-hour Defensive Driving classroom course at CHS beginning January 7th, 2015. The cost is \$150 and may be paid by check on the first day or in advance via a credit card. Students 15 years of age & older are encouraged to register.

Classes will be held on 10 consecutive Wednesdays (weather permitting) from 2:30-5:30pm. Parents of enrolled students will be required to take turns chaperoning; a schedule will be set prior to the first class. Bob, the instructor, will cover a basic introduction to driving, defensive driving strategies & Motor Vehicle rules & regulations.



Many insurance companies offer a discount for this course; please check with your provider. Just Rite Driving School also offers Behind-the-Wheel instruction at a special rate for students enrolled in both programs.

Upon successful completion of the State of NJ Motor Vehicle test given at the end of the course, a test waiver card will be issued, eliminating the need to be tested at the DMV. (For 15-year-old students, Just Rite Driving will retain the waiver card until their 16th birthday is reached.)

UPDATE We have been asked to share information about a possible district-wide Driver's Ed class to be (perhaps) offered on Saturdays from Jan- Mar (10 weeks) 8:30-11:30am. It would probably start 2nd week of January and would be held at High Tech High. If your student would be interested in registering for such a class, please email chs.psfa@gmail.com- being sure to specify 'Saturday class'. If High Tech gets enough people, they will go ahead and schedule the session.

Seniors: Our Early Action and Early Decision applications are being processed. 45% of the senior class has initial materials submitted to post-secondary institutions and we already have a few acceptances.

Now that your child's college list is solidified and manageable, it's time to start thinking about honors programs, merit aid, and scholarships.

Visit College web sites and see if merit aid is considered with the initial application (don't loose out if it's a separate application!) Call the office of admissions and ask when you may hear about merit awards. It is crucial to stay organized to be sure that key dates are not overlooked.

Although it's premature to think about need-based aid, know the FAFSA and CSS Profile due dates for each school on your child's list. Here is a link to the 2015-2016 FAFSA draft for parents who want to be familiar with the form prior to January 1st (http://chsguidancedept.blogspot.com/p/2015-2016-fafsa.html.) You will receive a separate mailing from the Guidance office with current information about filing the FAFSA. The CSS Profile is due prior to the FAFSA and dates vary; check the school's website for deadlines.

Visit the guidance blog and click on the Local Scholarships tab to see state and county scholarship opportunities that your child may qualify for.

<u>Juniors:</u> This is a time of testing and college exploration. You will be receiving a mailing from the guidance office with an individual conference date with your counselor. Please make every effort to attend.

We have started our college planning presentations in the Media Writing classes (Communications Technology class for Design Academy students) and our juniors are busy using Navaince to research colleges and universities.

Make sure your child has a College Board (www.collegeboard.com) and/or ACT (www.actsudent.org) account to make a testing plan and register for standardized tests. Visit the guidance blog for SAT and ACT dates (http://chsguidancedept.blogspot.com/p/sat-and-act-dates-2014-2015.html.)

There are many tools available to help you assist your child in the college search process. Visit the guidance blog and click on the College Resources tab to learn more.

<u>Sophomores</u>: Mark your calendar for the Spring NACAC College Fair on April 22nd and April 23rd at the Meadowlands Exposition Center in Secaucus. Don't forget to print labels with your child's name, address, year of high school graduation, and email address. It's a real time saver!

Freshman: During marking period 2, we will complete the process of getting all freshmen a

Naviance account during their Communications Technology class. If your child has already taken Communications Technology during marking period 1, please ask them to show you their personality type report.
