GOOD NEWS! A Driver Education Theory Class will again be made available at Communications High School. This program, being coordinated by the PSFA, is available to any student age 15 and older. The purpose of the course is to prepare for the NJ MVC written test. Bob Estler, of Just Rite Driving School will instruct students on basic principles of driving and the rules of the road. The cost is \$150.

The class will start on Wednesday, Jan 10, 2018 and will run for 10 weeks through Wednesday, March 21 weather permitting (there's no class on Wednesday January 24). The class will be from 2:30pm to 5:30pm. Students will be responsible for their own transportation home. In addition, a parent chaperone is needed at each class. Please be prepared to chaperone one class during your student's session. The schedule for chaperoning will be pre-arranged.

This is a theory class only, but enrolled students will also take the written MVC test on the last day of the course. Each student will receive a certificate upon successful completion of the class for possible insurance discount purposes. Please note that insurance discounts vary by individual insurance carriers. Please call your specific insurance company to determine your eligibility.

'Behind the Wheel' training is a separate course. Just Rite Driving School offers six-hour behind the wheel instructions at a discount for CHS students enrolled in the A Driver Education Theory Class. Grade-by-Grade Tips

IT'S NEVER TOO EARLY TO START PLANNING AND PREPARING FOR COLLEGE.

HELPFUL TIPS FOR EVERY GRADE.

<u>Seniors</u>: Please bring in your response letters from the colleges. You can record your own information by clicking on the pencil icon under *Colleges I'm Applying To* tab in Naviance. Fill in the admissions decision in the drop-down box.

We also keep track of scholarships the colleges offer you. We update your Naviance account when you provide us with the merit aid information you receive from the college. A running total can be viewed by scrolling to *Scholarship Applications* under *Colleges I'm Applying To*.

The FAFSA became available in October and is based on your 2016 income. Keep an eye on schools that require the CSS Profile: http://student.collegeboard.org/css-financial-aid-profile. Since every family's income is unique and most colleges have their own procedures for awarding aid, we recommend that you call the colleges to see if you must fill out the CSS profile. Determine if they need the information for need-based aid only. If you don't qualify for need-based aid and you are certain it will not impact merit aid, why spend the money? The CSS Profile will cost you \$25 for the first school you send it to and \$16 for each additional school.

The http://www.monmouthcountyscholarships.com site is resource to keep you informed of local scholarship opportunities.

<u>Juniors</u>: We are working with semester one junior seminar classes to organize the college search process. Juniors are finishing up their college essays and putting together portfolios that will be returned to the guidance office. We will use this information in college planning meetings, writing letters of recommendation, and in preparation for sending support documentation to the colleges and universities they will apply to.

We'll be beginning individual junior conferences soon. You will receive a letter with a date and time to meet with your child's counselor. Please bring your questions and let us start the process of working together to find a college match for your child.

<u>Sophomores</u>: Want to get a jump on the college planning process? Have your child download a practice SAT and a practice ACT. See which test they do better on and plan a testing strategy.

<u>Freshman</u>: It's not too early to start thinking about college planning. Colleges are looking for quality, not quantity when it comes to extracurricular endeavors. Start thinking about activities your child enjoys and encourage him or her to dedicate the limited time he or she has to take it to the next level. Be creative and think of ways that your child can demonstrate entrepreneurial strengths or leadership abilities. Good writers may want to pursue publication. Dancers may coordinate a performance for a local senior center. You get the idea.

I'm also a proponent of using the format of the Congressional Award in college preparation. Many of the things your child is doing can be logged, organized and recognized in a comprehensive package. Click here to learn more.
