CHS Driver's Ed Test Preparation

DATES: WEEKLY, JANUARY 10 – MARCH 21, 2018

TIME: 2:30-5:30PM

COST: \$150

AVAILABLE TO: AGE 15 AND OVER

GOOD NEWS! A Driver Education Theory Class will again be made available at Communications High School. This program, being coordinated by the PSFA, is available to any student age 15 and older. The purpose of the course is to prepare for the NJ MVC written test. Bob Estler, of Just Rite Driving School will instruct students on basic principles of driving and the rules of the road. The cost is \$150.

The class will start on Wednesday, Jan 10, 2018 and will run for 10 weeks through Wednesday, March 21 weather permitting (there's no class on Wednesday January 24). The class will be from 2:30pm to 5:30pm. Students will be responsible for their own transportation home. In addition, a parent chaperone is needed at each class. Please be prepared to chaperone one class during your student's session. The schedule for chaperoning will be pre-arranged.

This is a theory class only, but enrolled students will also take the written MVC test on the last day of the course. Each student will receive a certificate upon successful completion of the class for possible insurance discount purposes. Please note that insurance discounts vary by individual insurance carriers. Please call your specific insurance company to determine your eligibility.

'Behind the Wheel' training is a separate course. Just Rite Driving School offers six-hour behind the wheel instructions at a discount for CHS students enrolled in the A Driver Education Theory Class. Grade-by-Grade Tips

IT'S NEVER TOO EARLY TO START PLANNING AND PREPARING FOR COLLEGE.

HELPFUL TIPS FOR EVERY GRADE.

<u>PSAT Results</u> were distributed to students in December. Take the time to go over the paper report, but also be aware of the additional features available with the online report. PSAT results can be used to put together personalized SAT practice plan. Click <u>here</u> to learn how to connect your College Board and Khan Academy accounts.

<u>Students Taking English 4, Spanish 4, Advanced Design, or Calculus Semester Two</u> are eligible to purchase Seton Hall credits. We will be going into the classrooms to introduce the dual enrollment program. CHS will be participating in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP) testing on Wednesday, February 21, 2018. NAEP is often called the "Nation's Report Card." It is the largest continuing and nationally representative assessment of what our nation's students know and can do in core subjects. NAEP is congressionally mandated, and was first administered in 1969 to measure student achievement nationally. Teachers, principals, parents, policymakers, and researchers all use NAEP results to assess progress and develop ways to improve education in the United States. Fifty seniors were randomly selected to participate in this important assessment. Here is a short video if you would like to learn more.



Please bring in your college response letters. You can record your results in your Naviance account by clicking on the pencil icon under *Colleges I'm Applying To* tab. Fill in the result in the drop down box. Cafeteria flags go up after we receive your letters of acceptance in the guidance office.



We also keep track of scholarships the colleges offer you. We update your Naviance account when you provide us with the merit aid information you receive from the college. A running total can be viewed by scrolling to *Scholarship Applications* under *Colleges I'm Applying To*.




